The Impact of Toxic Chemicals in Drinking Water ...why a little bit is too much.



Are you concerned about how low levels of lead, arsenic, manganese and other toxins in drinking water can have a big impact on your health? Do you want to know how to protect yourself and those that are most important to you?

Bruce Lanphear, is a Professor of Environmental Health at Simon Fraser University and a Clinician/Scientist at B.C. Children's Hospital. He obtained his M.D. from the University of Missouri, and a Master of Public Health from Tulane University.

Dr. Lanphear will address the critical issue of the harmful biological consequences of toxic chemicals in the water we drink. His primary goal is to help prevent diseases and disorders including Compromised Digestive/Intestinal Health, Digestive Discomfort, Mood Disorders such as Depression, ADHD, Asthma, Compromised Cognition, Autism, Dementia, Kidney Disease, Parkinson's, Cancers, Heart Attacks and Strokes that are associated with exposure to toxins. He focuses on the largely preventable, worldwide epidemic of chronic disease and disability due to environmental contaminants such as Arsenic, Manganese and Lead in drinking water. Dr. Lanphear has produced powerful and timely videos such as *Beyond Flint* and *Little Things Matter*.
